

Team Simpson - good practice (conflict reduction plan!)




- Hand over your 'distractions'.

English Faculty

- There are two **separate** GCSEs.
- Students receive separate results.
- When colleges state that students require 'English' they mean English Language. They will look closely at your English Literature result especially if you do not achieve a pass in language.
- The skills overlap and must be applied to both GCSEs.

The Mountbatten School English Language - AQA

Spoken Language

Exam – a separate examination to be completed by all students.

This award qualifies the English language GCSE but does not contribute to the overall grade.

Students are awarded a pass, merit or distinction.

Students have revision (homework) set every week. They have one task for each GCSE from October. *Before October half term, students are only studying English Literature.*


Students are expected to complete these to a **high standard** and may wish to use a **revision folder** to keep these in. Many will be handed in on Google Classroom.

Tasks vary and include practising the skills required (extended writing, analysis of texts, increasing reading stamina) and knowledge based revision.

30-40 mins per homework

Students work will be checked for quality and quantity of work.






- 1. Students must know the required knowledge for **both** examinations.
- 2.Students must practise key skills of reading at speed, analysing unseen texts, evaluating complex texts, extended writing in time limited conditions, planning writing and proofreading.



- -Examination technique
- -Formulas for specific questions

How can you <u>support</u> students in their learning and revision?

- Discuss the key texts with them is there anything you can relate to the world today?
- Use cue cards to revise with students test them!
- Check their homework does it look like excellent work?
- Check which day homework for English is due.
- Read with or to them or encourage individual reading as much as possible excellent readers make excellent writers.
- Encourage them to proofread in all subjects.
- Expand their vocabulary through reading and discussion.


How students learn maths and how they'll be assessed

 - Paper 3 Calculator



Maths

- What homework looks like Sparx Maths
- Personalised to individual student
- Each question has a support video
- Expectation 100% completion (and therefore correct!)
- Don't do homework for them (and don't leave until the last minute!)








Maths

- Ask your teacher in class/via email








The best way for students to revise is using Sparx Maths. Students should log on to their account and follow these steps:


- 1. Click on "Independent learning"
- 2. Make sure the "Your curriculum" box is set to Fundamentals, Key stage 3 or GCSE
- Adjust the "Default level" to make sure the difficulty is just right (remember there's no point revising things you can already do!)
- 4. Type in the blue codes provided on the revision list (or just search for the topic)
- Make sure you've got pen and paper handy you'll need to write down some working out!
- If you're still struggling, watch the video and have another go. If that doesn't help, speak to your teacher (before the day of the test!)

What revising isn't:

Staring at exercise books or revision guides

Highlighting notes

Copying out chunks of the textbook / revision guide

Effective revision is:


Active - there should be a physical product that shows revision has been done.

Spaced - Spread the revision over the year.

Interleaved - break it into small chunks and mix up the order that you do the chunks in.







Step 2 - Memorise


Repetition is key here.

One method is to simply reproduce the mindmap / card, or a targeted part of it, from memory.

Other methods include:


- Look, cover, write, check of knowledge organisers and core questions
- Mnemonics
- Using quizlet to learn keywords






Step 3 - Test

To get the best grades in science you have to be able to **APPLY** the information you have learned and **ANALYSE** information you are given using what you **KNOW**.








Step 3 - Test


Using past paper questions is the best way to practice this.

Top tips:

- Write out the answers
- Check against the mark scheme
- Correct errors
- Start using notes if required
- Set time limits: 1 minute per mark









Step 4 - Gap filling

This is the key step. Once testing is complete it is important to work out what still needs to be worked on:

- Note down what was difficult as this is the point to start from in the next revision session on this topic.
- Correct any errors on revision summaries and add any missing detail so that they are complete.
- Highlight tricky ideas or concepts for review next time the material is studied.







Homework

Weekly quiz - this is revision.

Revise the topic first, then do the quiz.

Recommended that they write down a few of the answers they got wrong as a full sentence, and keep this information. (This is much better than just 'having another guess')

Builds a bespoke revision resource.
